

It really was the end of an era for a proud branch of the WI and one of the oldest in the country, having formed only three years after the original group. It was agreed that there were simply not enough members to make in financially viable to continue. "It will be greatly missed by the 14 members, most of whom have belonged to the WI for many years," said Ann Tranter, a committee member.

Help for retailers

Attendance at one of the events will make independent retailers eligible for a free coaching and mentoring session with a Martec consultant in their own store. These one-to-one sessions will enable the consultants to tailor advice to the specific needs of each business.

A group of students from Hurstpierpoint College have been selected to compete at the UK finals of a science and engineering competition after their exciting project caught the eye of judges. The five-strong team of Year 12 pupils from the school will now take their place in next year's final of The Big Bang UK Young Scientists & Engineers Competition.

The team, made up of Katy Jones, Lauren Schlup, Annabelle Ellin, Dominick Lawrence and James Hickmott have been announced as one of the winners of the regional heats at The Big Bang South East, with the project from the group entitled 'Designing a more effective wastewater screen.' As part of the project, they were sponsored by Southern Water to improve

the efficiency of the screens used in their wastewater treatment plants, without reducing the flowrate or significantly increasing costs.

Mark Titterington, Chief Executive of EngineeringUK, said: "The team from Hurstpierpoint College really impressed the judges with their project and we're excited to see how they do at the UK finals. It is a huge achievement to progress to this stage of the competition."

The students will be invited to attend the competition finals, which are taking place at The Big Bang Fair at Birmingham's NEC in March 2019. Here, they will vie for top prizes including the coveted title of UK Young Engineer and GSK UK Young Scientist of the Year.

In this feature, Hurst Life highlights an artist based in the village. This month's artist is Brian Rickard...

Bv Brian Rickard

Leaving school at 16, I trained as an architect and then spent 50 years working in that profession, building and running my own architectural practice with offices in Brighton and London. During that time, I was also a property developer, interior and product designer, construction project manager, high street Photoprint retailer and, to relax, a trad jazz drummer.

I started painting while still at school and was a winner in a national art competition at the age of 14. I studied at Southampton and Portsmouth Colleges of Art and Architecture and screen printing at Brighton College of Art.

I now mainly exhibit locally in galleries, pubs, restaurants and in my own private gallery, in addition to having had several one-man shows. I have regularly participated in the Hurst Open Studio Festival event. I have also made submissions to the RA Summer Fxhibition.

My time as an artist spans about 35 years, starting with traditional watercolour and oils, then progressing to silk screen printing, gouache and acrylic painting, montage and digitally created printed images.

My art continues to explore and develop the simplification and precise separation of strong bright colours, tones, lines and extreme contrast. This produces bold and vibrant semi-illustrative images, originally taken from real life subjects captured photographically on my travels and from the local environment, which are then worked to various degrees of abstraction, mainly presented in large format.

I work in a studio attached to my house in Hurstpierpoint, which also doubles as a private gallery and work space. I also have a studio in Spain where I spend three months of every year exploring and developing new ideas.

School pupils' enterprising success

In early December, Hurst College's Young Enterprise team, TOK, launched their product at the Carfax Marketplace in Horsham.

This was the first time any of the college's Young Enterprise teams have traded at Horsham and although the venue was brilliant, this year's team were not helped by the fact that it rained all day. The weather undoubtedly had an impact on the footfall but despite this, TOK managed to hit their break-even point and were into clear profit by the end of trading. The team remained incredibly positive, despite the lower than expected footfall, and relished the opportunity to launch their compact glass water bottles to the public.

TOK chose its product in response to stories currently in the news about plastic waste, to address the issue of animals in seas and waterways drowning in plastic. Their conveniently-sized bottles are practical, reusable and each one has been hand-etched with an animal at potential risk from the destruction of our oceans. Market research led the team to design images of penguins, turtles and dolphins – the most popular choices – and etch them on to the bottles along with their company logo. Each bottle is sold with a relevant information leaflet, and even the packaging can be recycled.



Mike Thatcher meets the extremely busy Ella Berthoud before Christmas...

"Pippi Longstocking? Because of the tights? That's fabulous!" I was relieved by Ella Berthoud's reaction on telling her one of my children called her this, after seeing her (yet again) sporting some fabulously colourful tights. Mind you, any literary reference was bound to please her as she is, amongst other things, a bibliotherapist. It was not a term I was familiar with so it was a pleasure, surrounded by books, to spend an hour with Ella at her Hurstpierpoint home to be enlightened.

Put simply, Ella prescribes novels to make people feel better. Practiced readers of fiction will certainly be aware of the uplifting benefits of a good novel. As a bibliotherapist Ella is able to call on her intuition, experience and the vast numbers of books she has read to put this into practice when people come to her with ailments of any sort. These can vary from depression, low self-esteem or bereavement. It was the last of these that was of particular interest to me, having lost a young family member this year, and this spiked her attention immediately. "One of the hardest things with bibliotherapy is bereavement, as when someone is bereaved they don't necessarily feel like sitting down and reading; you would often rather be doing something physical to keep you more 'occupied'."


She immediately reeled off Tuck Everlasting by Natalie Babbitt and What I Loved by Siri Hustvedt as books I should read and by the end of the hour and indeed in the days following our meeting, had volunteered other books for me as well. I was left with the impression that it was not just a literary and intellectual exercise for her but one fueled by a desire to help people and a belief in the power of fiction.

In a typical session she would start off by giving the 'patient' a questionnaire, which asks: what do you like to read, what do you hate to read, where and why do you read, do you read with anyone else, do you read aloud and other questions which give Ella an insight to their reading habits. She would subsequently interview them for an hour and then send a prescription of six books. "It's quite exhausting, like any kind of therapy I suppose. You get to know someone really well, you get to find out their reading habits, and also what's happened in their life."

Her ideal prescription is six novels, one on audio book and one to read aloud to a partner, a habit that most of us break once our children grow up. "It really is a lovely thing to do, but it's hard to make time to do it. My husband and I would read to each other probably once a week and more on holiday."

In 2013 she and co-Cambridge graduate Susan Elderkin wrote The Novel Cure, which functions like a reference book. "You look up an ailment like 'ageing parents' in the index and then you have a cure such as The Corrections by Jonathan Franzen or Family Matters by Rohinton Mistry which are both 'about' having ageing parents. One book gives you a humourous angle and the other a more serious and empathetic view. Other cures work in a different way - we sometimes prescribe a book that gives you the opposite approach to life to the one you are taking; for instance, if you are very shy, we might give you The Dud Avocado by Elaine Dundy, as this will show you how to live your life with effervescence rather than keeping it all bottled in. We sometimes use the way the prose is written as the cure, so for instance if you are a very apathetic person, we might give you The Postman Always Rings Twice by James Cain, as this has prose that makes you want to run around and seize the day."





The Novel Cure has exceeded expectations and its reach stretches far beyond these shores. "It's been translated into 20 languages and each country has done a different version, as they have different novels and different ailments. When we sold the world rights through Canongate, they decided to allow every country to change up to 20% of our book. France is the only country which wanted more, they demanded 40%."

The different ailments each country includes can be as interesting as the choice of novels. In the index for the Dutch edition you will find 'having too high an opinion of your own child' and in the Indian version, 'cricket, obsession with.' One thing is a constant across all editions however: "Our book is all about novels, none of it is non-fiction. When some foreign editors tried to squeeze in a short story or a memoir we had so say no it's The Novel Cure."

This led me to wonder, with the book being published, why would I need to contact Ella, rather than just look up the prescription in her book. I had overlooked the 'therapy' element of the word; how talking to someone about your concerns has huge benefits. And as it is done in a non-clinical setting with literature being at its heart a lot of people open up in ways they would otherwise struggle to do.

When I recommend a book or film to someone I am anxious that they should like it and often take it personally if they don't. Does Ella feel the same way about her prescriptions? "I've had an hour to get to know them and they would have told me in general what sort of books they like, be it science fiction or crime writing etc. The risk comes where I'm also trying to stretch them or help them in a personal way. For some people maybe one of the six is not going to be a perfect book; mostly we get the six right."

An article in the New Yorker by Ceridwen Dovey in 2015 about Ella has proved to be her most constant form of publicity and due to the nature of the Internet it periodically resurfaces to bring others to her door. However, she is glad that it is not a full-time occupation as she has to fit in all the other strings to her bow. As a painter of some repute, having studied Fine Art at

the University of East London after graduating from Cambridge, we could have spent the hour talking about her art. Or her teaching. "I teach art to adults every Monday night and have been doing that for ten years. I used to teach kids as well. I love teaching art, and take groups of students on art holidays every year to places like Sicily and Lake Garda, which is great fun. My first job in Hurst was teaching art to adults in the Village Centre, and it was an immediate way of meeting loads of people." Ella's next art class starts in January at the Guide Hut in the village.

Previously living in Hertfordshire, in a very rural setting, Ella had good friends and a cousin living in Hurst and when visiting was taken with this place: "I saw a peacock walking down the High Street and just fell in love with the place. It seemed to have everything: countryside, a great school (which was a big thing for us), was near to Brighton and London. It seemed a lovely community." Five years on the High Street was followed, five years ago, by a move to more spacious house on Cuckfield Road where she and husband Carl live with their three daughters.

As if she was not busy enough, she recently became a literary agent for fiction and works two days a week in London. She has six authors she works with, reading and editing their work before being presented to a publisher. The romantic in me was saddened that only rarely does she receive manuscripts; instead she has over 300 synopses in her inbox. Which does make just reading for fun a guilty pleasure, knowing the email awaits.

And finally, does she expect to have been given any books for Christmas this year? "Sadly no. People will be scared that I've already read them! But I would love to be given the full Man Booker Prize shortlist for Christmas." A hint to anyone who knows Ella for next year, perhaps. Although given that she is a painter, writer, bibliotherapist, teacher, mother of three and literary agent I'm not sure when she will get time to read them. But as they say, if you want something done, ask a busy person.

However, when we look to this year we can see that through the work of our Committee the Parish Council expects to be promoting dementia awareness to create Hurstpierpoint and Sayers Common as 'dementia friendly' villages. We are also investigating whether improvements can be made to the provision of pre-natal services for expectant mothers in the village. And, as in previous years, we will be supporting Hurst Festival and St Lawrence Fair.

We are pleased to offer small grants (up to several hundred pounds) to local groups and societies, so please contact us if you think we can help.

Representatives from the Mid Sussex Dementia Awareness team have visited us this year and run seminars for councillors and local groups. The next step is to link in with the traders, in conjunction with the Parish Council, and start some initiatives. An example could be to create respite centres and safe havens where people suffering from dementia and their carers could feel supported and helped.

Other key projects also involving our Council are underway, not least the expected launching of the Court Bushes Community Hub at Willow Way in the spring, and encouraging local residents to enjoy the benefits of our new Hurst Meadows parkland.

Our Committee is really keen to hear from local people to help us serve our community, so please come along to our meetings. Check the agenda on the Parish notice board to see what is coming up.

Have you ever found yourself in a fruitless mind spiral? Replaying a scenario that makes you sad or angry? Thinking about doing something but never getting started? Perhaps these thoughts start to spin out of control, leaving you feeling frustrated, angry, paranoid or confused? When you see it for what it is, doesn't it feel like a complete and utter waste of time and energy?

This negative 'hamster wheel' style of thinking has a massive impact on how you feel and these emotions impact your physiology, behaviour and your performance. This type of thinking produces a classic stress response, a release of cortisol and adrenalin which actually shuts down the frontal cortex of the brain impacting your ability to think logically, to plan and to make rational decisions and perform well when it counts.

Let's consider just one way of thinking on purpose, let's change our self-talk. The problem with self-talk is that it is often negative, critical, even harsh, and we aren't necessarily aware of what we might be saying to ourselves. The one guaranteed thing is that we are always listening and therefore we should be very careful about what we say. Many of my clients used to talk themselves down. They had a negative commentary running in their heads. This became the narrative to their lives and negatively impacted everything they tried to do. Often they didn't succeed and this reinforced their negative chatter, which further impacted their next attempt. My clients used to say things like 'I'm rubbish at this', 'this is hopeless', 'I'll never get there'... and guess what - they didn't, until they started thinking on purpose and taking control!

Top performers, whether in business, in sports or even on the stage, are able to take control of their thinking; they are able to use their 'self-talk' to direct their thoughts. In taking control they own their narrative

and therefore own their emotional response and, ultimately, control their performance. They think on purpose, they are positive and powerful in what they say to themselves and they have their phrases and mantras ready to counter any negative thoughts which might creep in.

They use positively framed language so that they constantly focus on what they want and not what they don't want; for example, they might say 'make it count' rather than 'don't miss', or 'I'm the expert' rather than 'the audience must know more than me' or 'I'm excited to retain this client' rather than 'I'm terrified of losing this business'.

To achieve more and to outperform our 'norm' we will want to think differently and think on purpose. As Einstein once said: 'Insanity is doing the same thing over and over again and expecting a different result'. When we practise our pre-performance, positive, self-talk, it creates a sense of control. It puts us in the driver's seat and it steers us to achieve our desired outcomes. Consistently thinking on purpose and achieving our goals reinforces our self-confidence and motivates us to achieve more. Think on purpose, take control, own your narrative and be your best self.

Stuffed aubergine with feta and pomegranate



Serves 4

Ingredients

2 aubergines

6 garlic cloves, unpeeled

8 tbsp olive oil

1 pomegranate

2 tbsp pomegranate molasses 100g/3½oz feta 4 tbsp mint, smallest leaves only salt and freshly ground black pepper

An effortless vegetarian supper dish using the meaty texture of aubergine, which is perfect during a healthy month when you may be cutting back on meat. Pomegranate molasses is a key ingredient of Middle Eastern Mediterranean cooking. A thick, fragrant and gloriously tangy reduction of pomegranate juice, this product is a really useful addition to the larder. It is the secret to this delicious recipe.



Method

Set the oven to 200C/180C Fan/Gas 6.

Cut the aubergines in half and score the cut sides with a lattice pattern, careful not to go down far enough to pierce the skin.


Place the aubergines cut-side up in a roasting tin along with the garlic cloves, still in their skins.

Brush the aubergines generously with olive oil, season with a little salt and bake for 1 hour until soft. Remove from the oven and scoop the flesh into a bowl without tearing the skin.

Pop the garlic cloves from their skins with your finger and thumb, then crush to a paste with the back of a fork.

Break the pomegranate and remove the seeds. Toss most of the seeds with the aubergine flesh, the crushed roasted garlic, a little salt and pepper, the pomegranate molasses and the mint leaves.

Spoon the filling into the empty shells, then crumble the feta cheese over the top, together with a few pomegranate seeds and a little more mint. Serve.

Roseanna's great photo

On last month's International Volunteer Day, a young volunteer from Hurstpierpoint (who spent three months working on a sustainable development project in Ghana) was shortlisted in an international photography competition.

Roseanna Leach's photo was chosen out of nearly 300 entries from across the world in a competition capturing the impact and experiences of young volunteers on the UK government-funded International Citizen Service (ICS) programme.

Roseanna, 21, took the photo whilst volunteering in Ghana from January to March 2017 with international development organisation International Service.

Roseanna's photo depicts George, a local artisan who she met through her work. She took this photo of him while he was making products out of nylon rope and plastic bags to sell.

ICS brings together young people from the UK and developing countries to volunteer across Africa and Asia. Since 2012, ICS has enabled more than 17,000 young people from the UK to volunteer overseas. Before leaving for Ghana, Roseanna fundraised £1,500, which will ensure that communities in developing countries can continue to benefit from the work of volunteers.

Roseanna said: "Our project focused on changing attitudes towards disability in the community and enabling disabled people to access opportunities by

making them aware of their rights.

"It was here that I met George, a local artisan who made chairs, beds and doormats out of plastic bags and nylon rope. His work was amazing, and really good quality, but it didn't get the volume of business he needed. I took photos of his work and taught him how to send photos by email, so that he could show his products to potential buyers.

"I love photography and am currently studying Media and International Development so it's great to be selected in this competition. ICS is one of the best volunteering opportunities for young people out there with legitimate sustainable NGOs to experience new things and get some valuable experience."

International Volunteer Day recognises the efforts of volunteers around the world.

Felicity Morgan, Director of ICS, said: "Thanks to UK Aid, young volunteers are making a positive difference in the world's poorest communities. Roseanna's photo gives a snapshot of just some of the great work being done, and we're proud to celebrate them this International Volunteer Day."

Short-eared owl

Short-eared owls are scarce winter visitors to Sussex. Swiss ornithologist Paul Geroudet described them as 'nomads who camp where the table is laid'. This winter dozens of these wandering diners were reported in Sussex and small parliaments (the collective term for owls, pub quizzers) lingered around the meadows along the county's river valleys, where they have tucked in to a bountiful rodent buffet.

In Sussex we have four breeding owl species. The most familiar will be the tawny owl – whose hoots and twit-to-woos can be heard in our woodlands. The barn owl is that pale spectral spirit that may be glimpsed in the headlights along country lanes at night. The longeared owl is our rarest, most elusive species. The little owl, which eats worms, was introduced here in the 19th century. www.sussexwildlifetrust.org.uk

Around 150 guests from the showing community attended the glittering black tie event, which has been held each year since 2015 and has raised in excess of £25,000 since it started.



debtor and the value of the debt.

Question: I have obtained a CCJ against a customer that didn't pay his bill. He is still refusing to pay, what can I do?
Answer: When trying to recover money you are owed by a debtor, obtaining a CCJ (County Court Judgment) is only half the battle. If that debtor still refuses to pay the debt, you will need to enforce the terms of the CCJ through the courts. There are several methods of enforcement available and which to use is somewhat

dependent on the information you have about the

If you happen to have previously acquired the debtor's bank account details by legitimate means (perhaps they were included on a previous payment he made to you), you can apply to the court for a third-party debt order. If the application is granted, the court will, if the account has sufficient funds, order the third party (in this example the bank) to pay you directly to settle the CCJ. Likewise, if the debtor is employed, and you have the contact details of his employer, you may be able to apply to the court for an attachment of earnings order. This will, if granted by the court, result in the employer making deductions from the debtor's wages every month to pay directly to you. The amount of the deduction is dependent on the debtor's salary.

If the debt is large, and you are aware that the debtor is a homeowner, you may be able to apply to the court for a charging order to be registered against his property. This will secure the debt but may not necessarily result in it getting paid. If, however, a charging order is made you may then be able to make a further application for an order that the property be sold by the court to pay off the CCJ.

Perhaps the easiest and cheapest means of enforcing, however, is to instruct the County Court bailiffs (or, alternatively, if the debt is greater than £600, the High Court enforcement agents). Once instructed, they will attend the debtor's property and demand payment of the debt. If they are not able or willing to pay, the bailiffs or enforcement agents are authorised to remove goods owned by the debtor to the value of the CCJ.

It is important to consider the financial status of a debtor before issuing court proceedings. A 'man of straw' may of course be unable to satisfy a CCJ, irrespective of which method of enforcement you use. For a modest fee, a private detective can be instructed to report on the financial standing of an individual or company that owes you money, and this is a prudent step to take prior to commencing formal legal action against a debtor.

BOOK REVIEW


One of the earliest Bible stories most people learn is the tale of David and Goliath. It's surprising to realise that the 'simple shepherd boy' hero is the same David who later in life sends a man to his death, in order to take the man's wife as his own. In this novel Geraldine Brooks tells the story of King David in all of its complexity, through the testimony of those closest to him.

David dominates these pages just as he dominates the lives of those around him, but even he is unable to stop events unfolding as prophesised by Natan, who is the book's narrator.

Natan joins David's service as a young boy and remains by his side as a loyal and trusted advisor for many years (in today's language he dares to speak truth to power) until David's actions lead him to transfer his allegiance to the young prince Shlomo (Solomon).

Brooks chose to use the Hebrew spellings for the names of the principal characters, but this level of distancing from the standard biblical version of these events helps the reader see them from a new perspective. I've read and enjoyed other titles by this author ('Year of Wonders' & 'March') and consider this book her most compelling read to date.




